

Discontinuation of Clinical Laboratory Licensure Program

Senate Bill 622, passed during the 2018 Florida legislative session, made several changes to health care licensure laws within the State, including the repeal of the Agency's authority to license Clinical Laboratories effective July 1, 2018. Providers who perform clinical laboratory testing must continue to obtain and maintain federal certification from the Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments (CLIA) program and, when applicable, comply with clinical laboratory personnel licensure requirements.

Applications

The Agency will continue to accept applications for initial licensure through June 30, 2018. Each applicant will be informed of the pending changes to statute and will be given the opportunity to request their application and fee be returned to them prior to the Agency's review. Initial applicants who do not want their application returned must complete the application process, including survey, no later than June 30, 2018 in order to receive a license.

Currently licensed clinical laboratories whose license expires prior to July 1, 2018 must renew their license if they intend to provide clinical laboratory services between the date of expiration and July 1, 2018. Applications to renew a license that expires on or after July 1, 2018 will be returned to the applicant unprocessed. Applications to change an address or other information on a current license will continue to be processed through June 30, 2018.

Fees

All applications submitted for review and processing must be received with the requisite fee. Application fees will not be prorated and are not refundable.
